THE FRICK PITTSBURGH ANNOUNCES SUMMER FRIDAYS AT THE FRICK!

PITTSBURGH, PA, May 20, 2022 – The Frick Pittsburgh announces the 2022 season of **Summer Fridays at the Frick**, marking the return of the summer series to in-person programming for the first time since 2019. On four Friday evenings spread between June and September, the Frick will welcome visitors for an exciting lineup of live musical performances, delicious food truck offerings, artmaking activities, and family fun on the beautiful Frick lawns.

In addition to free, outdoor entertainment, **Summer Fridays** attendees also will enjoy special FREE admission to the Frick's summer exhibitions, **Romare Bearden: Artist as Activist and Visionary** and **SLAY: Artemesia Gentileschi & Kehinde Wiley**. Car and Carriage Museum, Greenhouse, Grable Visitor Center, and the Frick Museum Store, and both exhibitions will be open to visitors until 9:00 p.m.

Summer Fridays at the Frick dates: Fridays, June 17, July 22, August 19, and September 2, 2022.

Hours: The Frick is open from 10:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. Admission-free performances are held on the North Lawn on the Frick grounds beginning at 6:30 p.m.

ABOUT THE FRICK PITTSBURGH

Located on the estate of 19th-century industrialist Henry Clay Frick, The Frick Pittsburgh offers authentic experiences with art, history and nature that inspire and delight. Visitors of all ages and backgrounds are warmly welcomed to explore The Frick Art Museum, offering world-class collections of European art and Chinese porcelain alongside an active schedule of temporary exhibitions; Clayton, the Frick family's French château-style mansion (remodeled by architect Frederick J. Osterling in the 1890s); the Car and Carriage Museum; and a large working greenhouse designed by architects Alden & Harlow—all nestled on six acres of beautifully landscaped lawns and gardens in Pittsburgh's East End. Amenities include an Education Center, the Frick children's playhouse (also designed by Alden & Harlow), The Café at the Frick, and the Grable Visitor Center, which houses the Frick Museum Store.
