"Lewis Hine Pictures America" Exhibition

Opens Feb. 21 at 10 a.m.

This exhibition highlights the work of Lewis Hine, the "father of documentary photography." Hine's artistic photos exposed the harsh realities faced by immigrants, children and the working class in their everyday lives during the early decades of the twentieth century. The exhibition includes some of Hine's most famous images of newly arrived immigrants at Ellis Island, children at work, the steel industry in Pittsburgh and the construction of the Empire State Building.
