From a costume tea to spooky stories, Frick visitors are invited to have fun this haunted holiday

Spooky Spirits Walk

Friday, Oct. 10 & 17, 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m.

Visitors are invited to get in the spooky spirit with a fall beverage while they explore the macabre, haunting history of Pittsburgh's East End on a guided walk of the Frick grounds. From the city's link to the "crime of the century" to the real life origins of the city's most enduring urban legends, discover the darker side of the East End.

Two tour times are available per date at 6:30 and 7:00 p.m. Attendees should register for one. The site walk will take approximately 90 minutes. The site walk takes place outdoors, rain or shine and the tour route is wheelchair accessible.

Two drink vouchers are included in the cost of the ticket. Visitors must be 21+ for alcoholic beverages. Non-alcoholic beverages are also available. Following the tour, each attendee will receive a sweet treat to take home. \$45 members; \$50 non-members; \$25 students.

Visitors are encouraged to put their spooky knowledge to good use. Stories from Spooky Spirits will be featured as trivia questions for <u>Trivia Night at the Frick</u> on Oct. 24.

Tickets must be purchased in advance. Reservations are for teams of 2-4 people. Teams can purchase their tickets individually or as a group. Teams will register their team name upon arrival at check-in. Cost of admission includes light snacks, a Halloween candy buffet and two drink tickets that can be redeemed for wine, beer, soda, bottled flat or sparkling water or a specialty mocktail. \$30 members; \$35 non-members.
