Mother's Day High Teas, Braddock Night & Other May Events at The Frick Pittsburgh

PITTSBURGH – This May, The Frick Pittsburgh will host the final programs related to the exhibition, [Lewis Hine Pictures America](#), which closes on May 17. The programs include a multicultural dance showcase, guided tours of the exhibition and the Nationality Rooms at the University of Pittsburgh, and a night where Braddock businesses will set up pop-up booths on the Frick grounds.

The Frick will also offer several non-exhibition programs for May, including Mother's Day high teas and a special evening tour of Clayton, the historic home of Henry Clay Frick.

May Events at the Frick

Journeys in Movement: A Multicultural Dance Showcase

May 2 at 2 p.m.

Bridging past and present through movement and music, this performance explores the paths and stories of early immigrants inspired by the visuals and spirit of the "Lewis Hine Pictures America" exhibition. Allegro Dance Company, Grecian Odyssey Dancers and the Shovlin Academy of Irish Dance convey these narratives through expressive choreography, reflecting heritage, identity and the enduring human spirit. This program is followed by a Q&A with the performers. Exhibition admission is not included. \$15 members, \$20 non-members, \$10 for college students with ID. Lunch Pail Lecture: Maxo Vanka Millvale Murals

May 7 at 12 p.m.

Get acquainted with the murals of Croatian artist Maxo Vanka, located in Millvale, through a presentation by the murals' Director of Education & Interpretation, Becky Gaugler. Participants will discover how this local treasure, covering the walls and ceiling of the sanctuary of the St. Nicholas Croatian Catholic Church, was painted over two intense periods in 1937 and 1941 and reflect the lived experiences of the church's working-class, immigrant congregation. Hear stories about the artist, the murals, and the history of the church and its Croatian immigrant congregation. These unique murals are at the intersection of history, art, and social justice – with timeless themes of love, struggle, faith and hope. Exhibition admission is not included. \$10 for members, \$15 for non-members, \$5 for college students with ID. Beginning with a visit to the Nationality and Heritage Rooms, classrooms gifted from the ethnic communities who helped build Pittsburgh, and ending with a tour of the "Lewis Hine Pictures America" exhibition, this program will take attendees back in time to discuss the rich cultural fabric of Pittsburgh. \$35 for members, \$45 for non-members, \$20 for college students with ID.
